John Anderson – My Favourite Woodland Treasures

As Keeper of the Gardens at Windsor Great Park, which, annually, attract 1.75m visitors, John Anderson is responsible for The Savill Garden, Valley Gardens and the private garden at Frogmore House.

Having trained at the National Botanic Gardens in Dublin and the Royal Botanic Gardens in Kew, John has utilised his skills and developed his plant knowledge as Head Gardener of Mount Usher Gardens in Ireland, at the National Trust for Scotland's Inverewe Gardens and at Exbury Gardens in Hampshire.

John enjoys travelling to India, Chile, Australia and South Africa to study plants in their natural habitats. He is a recipient of the RHS Veitch Memorial Medal – an international award that honours individuals for their exceptional involvement in the advancement of the science, art and practice of horticulture – for furthering many careers by sharing his expertise and serving on the RHS Woody Plant Committee since 2007, formerly as Vice Chair.

St Mellion International Resort, Saltash PL12 6SD Johnny Walkers – Daffodils: Commercial Production and Ways of Showing

The son of a Dutch bulb grower, Johnny gathered much knowledge by working with his father in the school holidays and at weekends.

He began his career as Technical and Quality Manager with the bulb co-operative, Lingarden. With growers spread across seven counties, Johnny advised them on the latest growing techniques and helped to develop a business that exported daffodils (including many tonnes from Cornwall) to Europe, Scandinavia and North America.

In 1986, Johnny established a mail order company focusing on unusual daffodils and other specialist bulbs. This was the start of his showing journey at RHS Chelsea and the North of England Horticultural Society's Harrogate Flower Show.

In 2016, Johnny was awarded the Peter Barr Memorial Cup for services to the daffodil industry. His lectures will cover more than a century of tulip growing in the eastern counties of the UK and what it takes to produce daffodils commercially.

## Magnolias, Camellias and a Sunday Roast

Join us for a unique opportunity to enjoy a delicious two-course lunch in the splendid surroundings of this Grade II listed manor house by kind courtesy of Alverne and Annabel Bolitho.

Created by the family in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, Trewidden Garden – one of the Great Gardens of Cornwall – hosts more than 300 magnolias (including five champion trees) and camellias, the National Collection of Rhododendron (Wilson 50 Azaleas), and a magnificent stand of tree ferns within an open cast tin mine.

We hope that the Trewidden Belle and other fine earlyflowering magnolias will be in bloom when we visit, as well as earlier flowering camellias.

Head Gardener, Richard Morton, will lead us on tours of Trewidden's 15-acre garden and share the secrets of its horticultural heritage and his extensive knowledge.

Having worked for more than 30 years in horticulture, Jeremy has a wealth of information to draw from for these lectures.

His career has spanned growing bedding plants and fieldgrown trees to crops and weeds for chemical testing. He has also worked for English Heritage and the University of Cambridge as a gardener, and as Head Gardener for a number of private estates.

Jeremy took over Strete Gate Camellias in a picturesque spot near Dartmouth in South Devon, overlooking the sea, in 2011 and now propagates and sells in excess of 500 different camellias to garden centres and other retail outlets.

He is a regular exhibitor at RHS shows where he has previously been awarded a Gold medal. He is preparing to attend the RHS Chelsea Flower Show in 2024 and will be revealing some tricks of the trade to help us exhibit our camellias at the CGS Spring Flower Show.

### Trewithen House and Gardens, Grampound Road, Truro TR2 4DD

One of the Great Gardens of Cornwall, Trewithen is renowned for its Georgian house, which is set in 30 acres of wood and parkland filled with an historic collection of specimen rhododendrons, camellias and magnolias.

The house and gardens have undergone significant restoration with new areas opened to the public in recent years.

This event will consist of three segments: a private tour of the gardens with Head Gardener, Gary Long; a guided visit inside Trewithen House with its Great Saloon, which looks out on to the spectacular South Lawn and is an outstanding example of the Rococo style that was so popular in the mid-18<sup>th</sup> century, and some free time for your quiet exploration of the grounds.

Places are limited due to visitor number limits in the house.

## Thursday 23rd

Lower Penbothidnow, Constantine and Caervallack, St Martin, The Lizard

Lower Penbothidnow is an undulating garden, which includes an interesting series of 'rooms' with clipped hedges in a walled garden, a wildflower meadow, a woodland walk and terraces below the house.

There is also a tree fern 'pit', numerous seating areas, mature trees, shrubs interspersed with sculptures and herbaceous planting.

Developed over two decades by artist, Louise and architect, Matt, who is also a cob specialist, the garden at Caervallack features cob-constructed walls and garden buildings as well as 'rooms' with unusual plant combinations.

With lots of low clipped hedges around beds planted by Louise who is an herbaceous fanatic, a wildflower meadow, a woodland walk, a cob-walled garden, a wisteria walk and a bridge over to a wilderness garden, there is much to enjoy in this tranquil setting.

### Marsh Villa, Par and Bodmin Nursery

A hidden gem in the heart of Par, Marsh Villa is a magical three acres of water and woodland garden, which lies in a former tidal creek and is rich in variety and conservation significance.

Planting began in 1988 with a shelter belt and now consists of a series of distinct areas with a large pond, surrounded by mature herbaceous borders and beautiful mixed beds amongst a charming network of waterways that drain the Treesmill marsh levels.

Bodmin Nursery is one of the biggest and best growing nurseries in the south west; however, it has a secret history dating back some 900 years.

Owners, Mark and Linda Lawlor, will guide us through its past and present, and reveal what it takes to be a commercial nursery business in 2024.

# Garlenick Manor, Grampound and Mitchell Fruit Garden, Mitchell

Garlenick Manor is of late 17<sup>th</sup> century origin but its splendid walled garden dates from the 1600s.

The manor was rebuilt in 1812 following a fire but after World War I, the house and gardens fell into disrepair until rescued by the current owners in 1962.

With a vision to restore the gardens to their original plan, extensive landscaping and planting, including an avenue of Dicksonia, has recently occurred under the watchful eye of designer, Michael Harvey, who will conduct our tour.

Mitchell Fruit Garden was founded in 1977 when hedges were planted as windbreaks and a remote-controlled underground irrigation system and reservoir were installed. It has evolved into a successful business, supplying retail and wholesale outlets with a variety of soft fruits and a 'Pick Your Own'.

## **Garden Visit**

## Thursday 19th

Hillside, St Buryan; Regent Terrace, Penzance; Boscrowan, Heamoor and The Steward's House Garden, St Michael's Mount with Garden Designer, Michael Harvey and Lunch

Created by Michael Harvey, these gardens highlight the importance of good structural design in smaller spaces.

Situated on a steep slope, Hillside includes four terraces, which are ingeniously interlinked by granite steps. Aeoniums and other succulents adorn the walls whilst the borders are planted with geraniums, tulbaghia, cinerarias, fuchsias and euphorbias.

The gardens at Regent Terrace echo the architecture of its Grade II listed townhouse with paving and planting to reflect its semi-circular stair bays and bow windows.

The redesigned front garden at Boscrowan incorporates terracing, checkerboard paving and growing squares with yew domes.

The Steward's House Garden is a peaceful courtyard with formal beds and herringbone brick paving that features a new sculpture, entitled 'St Michael', created by Tom Leaper and commissioned by Lord and Lady St Levan.
